I don't like Pop Music

But what I do like, I love passionately.

Forgive me for what I do not regret is an exhibition that reflects the hybrid worlds of Diogo Gama, where painting, drawing and textile are interconnected, in order to weave narratives and reflections that explore the complexity of human existence. From the textures, shapes, colors, to the lines, words and drawings, the artist presents a set of works that evoke questions of identity, as well as scenarios that are simultaneously unexpected and introspective.

Inspired by stories, literature, as well as his own experience, Diogo Gama builds a dualist visual poetic, where the familiar coexists with the unpredictable, and the self-reference dialogues with the imagination. Camp aesthetics, along with the usage of words, are highlighted, as they act as a narrative axis that connects notions of identity, or even contradictory ideas. In turn, the topic of identity emerges as a fluid entity that shapes the subjectivity that inhabits the presented pieces. This idea alludes to the phenomenological theory of Jean-Paul Sartre (Being and Nothingness, 1943) about consciousness and the singularity of human existence. The author argues that human consciousness, or being-for-itself, not only is flexible, but it is also constructed through constant choices and notions, whether free, or contradictory. The title of the exhibition, Forgive me for what I do not regret, as well as the pieces, echo this paradox of consciou-





sness. Being regretful or not, what is fixed or what is fluid, being-in-itself or being-for-itself. Diogo Gama presents pieces that incorporate these notions, inviting the public to interpret the diverse imageries and narratives. In this manner, each work showcases, not only an inherent subjectivity, but it is also part of an evolving artistic practice of exploring alternative references, aesthetics and paths.

Biography

Diogo Gama (1998, Almada, Portugal) is a multidisciplinary visual artist who explores self--fictional narratives that reference literature and queer history, in order to interconnect notions of authorship, sexuality and domesticity. Recently, his work has been centered around Camp sensibility and aesthetics, as a form of protesting against forms of violence. In 2022, Diogo Gama completed a MFA in Fine Arts at the Goldsmiths University in London, where he is currently based. Among his exhibitions, some highlights are "Teleny" (solo) at General Assembly, London (2023); "Half Empty" (duo) at Buraco, Lisbon (2024); and "Kenophobic Pantomimes" (group) at Below Grand Gallery, New York (2023).
