Between the mystical and the human, proximity and distance, the complete and the unfinished. Pedra-Sal is a painting exhibition by Pedro Anacleto that embodies the dualities inhabiting his work, establishing a space where the mundane and the ethereal experience intersect and coexist.

The ethereal does not present itself as a distant notion, but rather as a presence revealed through symbols, objects, gestures, or personal and collective experiences. In this sense, the mystical is proposed as a dimension of human experience itself, which echoes a paradox: something that originates within us, and yet, transcends us; something inevitably present, but intangible and unobtainable. Mircea Eliade wrote a book about the dynamics between the profane and the sacred, in which he developed the concept of hierophany as a revelation of the ethereal. The author stated that "By manifesting the sacred, any object becomes something else, yet it continues to remain itself, for it continues to participate in its surrounding cosmic milieu" ("The Sacred and the Profane", Mircea Eliade, 1963).

This notion resonates within *Pedra-Sal*, where Pedro Anacleto explores the coexistence of the mystical and the human. As in Eliade's view, the sacred does not belong to a separate realm, on the contrary, it is summoned and manifests itself through hierophanies, within the very fabric of reality, or the profane. In the exhibition too, the celestial reveals itself in dualistic imagery, by means of gesture, as well as iconographic references.

In this confluence of forces, Pedro Anacleto creates a space for contemplation and encounter between diverse dualities, where the mundane approaches the ethereal, inviting the public to reflect upon the condition of human experience.

Biography

Pedro Anacleto (2002, Lisbon) is a multidisciplinary visual artist who explores personal and biographical narratives, through painting, video art and sculptural objects. His practice interconnects notions of sexuality, identity, experiences and myth, by means of iconographic and symbolic images. In 2024, Pedro Anacleto completed a Bachelor of Painting at the Fine Arts University (FBAUL), in Lisbon, where he is currently based. Among his group exhibitions, some highlights are "Que Emoção!" (2025) at Sociedade Nacional de Belas-Artes, Lisbon; "Breaking the Patterns" (2024) at Galeria NowHere, Lisbon; "Epílogo" (2024) at Galeria PLATO, Évora; and the exhibition "Arte Jovem" (2024) of Fundação Millennium BCP, Lisbon.
